


INTRODUCTION

"Create a space for mothers to meet and de-stress."

"Have most of the program spaces accessible on the ground floor that elderly and those with disabilities can easily access."

"Have seating for the elderly and for those who are unhoused."

"Have words written in different languages, because this neighbourhood is very diverse."


We need spaces to de-stress. It's lonely when you don't speak the language well and you want to meet people, there's no space to gather.
