The scholarships promote youth empowerment, diversity and community safety in Toronto.

Students receive up to \$4,000 to pursue postsecondary studies or professional training.

The Investing in Our Diversity Scholarship Program was founded in 2001 by the late Bill McMurtry, Founding Partner, Blaney McMurtry LLP, and Kevin Lee, former Executive Director of Scadding Court Community Centre. Toronto Community Housing became a partner in 2006.




Greetings from Blaney McMurtry LLP







Toronto Metropolitan University




UBAYY ABRAHIM ELIASYork University




ANDRE ERIC DIXON BLACKETT


