EC26.8 – Supporting Food Security in St. James Town

Food security has become a more critical issue as a result of the social and economic conditions that are affecting all of us in The City and all over the country. Residents of St. Jamestown are made of tenants mainly and most of us live in social housing and private market apartments where the vast majority are low-income and working class; tenants. I wholeheartedly support the capital improvements necessary to establish a community food space at 200 Wellesley; and to continue collaborating with third party community agencies to deliver these services.

Most of our voices are not heard because we often feel excluded and ignored, and within this context we are not participating enough, and missing an opportunities to share our experiences and to shape policies.
