

CAREER EXPLORATION

BOLT Day of Discovery

A unique and immersive career exploration opportunity for youth curious about or interested in a career in construction. Participants tour an active Tridel construction site & George Grown College School of Construction Management, learn about careers at different stages of construction, experience the realities on site, meet trades and construction professionals on site and more.

BOLT Job-Shadowing

A two-week job-shadowing experience on a Tridel construction site for youth who would like more exposure to career opportunities. Observe and learn from up to 10 different skilled trades and management professionals and discover countless other careers in construction. Safety training, travel subsidy and stipend provided.

BOLT SpeakOuts

In-person or virtual information session with industry professionals to help raise awareness about the variety of careers available in construction, how to get started and more.

BOLT Financial Awards

Offered to full-time students pursuing construction related college or university programs. Successful candidates receive up to \$5,000 for the school year. Applications window is between January – April every year.
