#### THE RULES

Street Ebike- Bike Users

· Ebike- Bike users must sign in a waiver form and registration is important - this form is being developed by

the legal team of the TCHC we will be making recommendations if needed.

- · Proof of Purchase not required but a photo of the Ebike must be submitted
- Ebike- Bike users must need a second FOB to access the Ebike Lockers in the underground parking this
  policy is based on the Car Parking Policy an Id will be required, your unit and the lease agreement contract
  number
- · Scooters Mobility users must have "Contents Insure" for your mobility devices
- . Ebike Bike users will have access 24/7 to the lockers , access to a Power Outlet to charge your ebike
- · Ebike / Bike Users please use original parts only using mix batteries can result in fire.
- · Ebike / Bike Users will have access to a locker key and a fire sprinkle is located above each unit in case of fire.
- . Ebike/ Bike users must be aware there are CCTV Cameras in the garage for your safety.
- Ebike / Bike users must report Theft / Damage to their own bike no unusable bikes, bike parts or other stored items, we want to discourage hoarding.
- . Ebike / Bike users must provide their own locks for their Ebikes
- Ebike / Bike Users due to limit space on Ebike per unit. as we expand more spots on phases 2 and 3
  opportunities to include families/ couples and children might be able to store two Ebikes/ bikes
- Ebike/ Bike are awarded by Seniority one per unit and there will be a waiting list to add your name when I spot becomes available
- · Ebike/ Bike users found breaking the rules will be removed

We should strike a sub committee of the "Community Building Committee" to welcome more residents to shape this made in Street Policy that could potential lead to a permanent TCHC board policy.


Because we don't have POLICY the lockers in the basement are being used as personal Lockers.. for CONTENTS.. see picture?

# Community Safety Advisory Sub-Committee Public Minutes

November 18, 2024

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- Next year, TCHC is considering being more intentional about moving tenancies out earlier in the process.
- Certain circumstances, such as gun violence, contribute to higher concentrations of issues in specific communities.
- N5 notices may be issued in communities with higher risks of gun violence however, the issue of eviction is portfolio-wide, not limited to specific areas.
- TCHC engages with tenants throughout their tenancy, including during and before the eviction process.
- In extreme cases where eviction is necessary, TCHC provides a "soft landing" by connecting tenants with organizations or support systems for relocation.
- CSU has the authority to conduct arrests on TCHC properties, wellness checks, and enforce trespass orders on TCHC property.
- CSU's enforcement powers are delegated through a memorandum of understanding with the boards of TPS and TCHC.

#### Item 12F,

I spoke last January 2025 at the Police Services Board and explained of the benefits of equipping the CSU officers with TECHNOLOGY for investigation of COMPLEX, LOUD and INTERMITTENT NOISES between the hours of 11:00 pm and 7:00 am we have a good conversation

I am recommending the either you accept that you can't deal with those type of noises investigation.. it is a bitter and frustrating experience.. I have logged 120 CALLS to the CSU since September 27 2024..

Why not pass the problem to 311 Toronto? They have the technology to investigate those noises. I have an OPEN CASE with the MLSE investigation unit .. I am next on the line to test their EQUIPMENT..

#### Also:

I continue advocating for Body Worn Cameras for the CSU officers. And it will help the complaints against CSU a VIDEO will help assist in the investigation..

I have a complaint against a Dispatcher. I am still waiting to hear back from. Dispatch Manager, Jason Kirkby and also two other CSU one in TRAINING by the way..

#### **Public Complaints**

As required by the agreement between the Toronto Community Housing Board of Directors and the Toronto Police Services Board, TCHC has established a complaint investigation procedure for Special Constables which corresponds with the procedure used by the TPS. TCHC provides a

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quarterly report of all complaints and their investigations to the Toronto Police Services Board. Any findings of misconduct are reported forthwith.

There were 15 public complaints, and 1 internal complaint submitted to the Community Safety Unit in 2024. A public complaint is defined by the complaint being received from a member of the public or directly affecting a member of the public. An internal complaint points to a complaint that originated internally, or by extension, from TPS.

Two of the public complaints are currently under investigation by PRS.

Nine public complaints investigated by TCHC were found to be unsubstantiated and one was substantiated. Two complaints are being investigated by TCHC, one has been withdrawn.

The 2019 Ombudsman's Report<sup>2</sup> relevant to Special Constable complaint investigations was adopted and the Complaints Investigator position was created for CSU complaints. This position is now housed under the Legal Division, which is a separate unit from CSU. The hiring and implementation were initiated in Q4 2020, and the Complaints Investigator commenced their role in Q1 2021.

FOB access



So I applied for a TRANSFER but was denied twice - I am not applying again.. I have a proposal


SOUNDPROOF My unit, the Ceiling and the Floor, specially the unit above and the unit bellow. I need to have my sleep back..

Are members of the public able to peek into the COMPLETED Review of the CSU for future conversation?


# Tenant Engagement System: Engage Together Update Item 12B
