A deputation is a written or verbal presentation made by tenants, staff, or members of the public to the Toronto Community Housing (TCHC) Board of Directors (the Board) or one of its Committees. Deputations must be related to a topic that is on the public Agenda for the meeting. Why you should depute • Have a say. Deputation gives you the opportunity to have a say in the decisions that impact you and your community. • Make a difference. When you depute, you help shape policy decisions that can
